ROTATING OUTAGE UPDATE

(February 18, 2021-Greenville, Texas) The Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT) suspended rolling outages as of midnight.

Per GEUS' latest operational update from ERCOT we will remain in EEA3 status through Friday morning. Rotating outages could be necessary if demand for power exceeds energy reserves.

ERCOT protocol includes an ALL CLEAR communication to all utilities once the emergency is over. No utilities have received this ALL CLEAR notice.

"It is still GEUS' goal to minimize the impact of this emergency on our customers while assisting ERCOT with fortifying Texas' grid"" said GEUS General Manager Alicia Hooks.
